


The establishment of the South Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Organisation (*SPRFMO*) and the effect of closures of high seas.

UNGA 61/105

 Calls upon regional fisheries management organizations or arrangements with the competence to regulate bottom fisheries to adopt and implement measures, in accordance with the precautionary approach, ecosystem approaches and international law, for their respective regulatory areas as a matter of priority, but not later than 31 December 2008 ...

SPRFMO Area














UNGA 61/105 Article 83

- Assess whether bottom fishing would have Significant Adverse Impacts (SAIs) on Vulnerable Marine Ecosystems;
- Identify VMEs and impact of bottom fishing;
- Close VMES
- Move on where VME's encountered.

Interim Measures


- The assessment on whether bottom fishing would have significant adverse impacts on vulnerable marine ecosystems (VMEs);
- To identify VMEs and the adverse impact that bottom fishing would have on these VMEs;
- To close VMEs including sea mounts on the basis of best available scientific information;
- To require members of RFMOs or to cease bottom fishing activities where VMEs are encountered;

Definitions?

- Vulnerable marine ecosystems;(VME)
- Significant adverse impacts; (SAI)
- Ecosystem approach;
- Precautionary principle;
- Sustainable management.

Interim Measures: 30 Sept 2007

- States to take measures "in accordance with their laws and regulations" to limit bottom trawling;
- Have regard to
 - ecosystem approach to fisheries management;
 and
 - the precautionary approach;
- To achieve:
 - sustainable management of fish stocks
 - Protection of VME's



Interim Measures Order.

- The *limitation* of bottom trawl effort to existing levels (2002 to 2006 levels);
- A complete closure of some areas previously fished;
- Closure of areas where VMEs are known to occur;
- Closure of 5 nautical miles of any site in the SPRFMO area where evidence of VMEs are encountered;

UNGA order;

- Assess whether bottom fishing would have Significant Adverse Impacts (SAIs) on Vulnerable Marine Ecosystems;
- Identify VMEs and impact of bottom fishing;
- Close VMES
- Move on where VME's encountered.

Flaws:

- SPRFMO has not been formally constituted
- The measures are interim;
- Scientific assessments not in;
- No internal assessment and management protocols

Flaws ctd.

- 2002 to 2006 catch years were arbitrarily chosen;
- ill-defined concepts such as VMEs and SAIs
- Assessments based on selective information and modelling

Grounds for Review

- Interim measures out of step with UNGA;
- Irrelevant considerations;
 - Flawed science;
 - Measures are voluntary;

Conclusion

- Look through the 'green' rhetoric;
- Get some rigour into the definitions;
- Build in flexibility.
